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Overview

Knoxville's Community Development Corporation (KCDC) provides housing options for the residents of Knoxville and Knox County that tailor to the specific needs of families, seniors and disabled low-income residents. In partnership with the University of Tennessee's College of Social Work Center for Applied Research and Evaluation, a survey was developed to assess the needs of the residents of KCDC Communities. Paper surveys, as well as an online option, were provided to residents of 18 Communities. A total of 836 surveys were completed.

The overwhelming majority of residents who participated in the survey (98.1%) reported that English was the most spoken language in their home. Approximately six percent of respondents indicated that they have served in the US Military. One-third of respondents (33.1%) have earned a high school diploma and another 12.7% have received a GED/HiSET. Over a quarter of respondents (26.8%) did not finish high school.

Results and Discussion

Household Information for Families

Less than half of the families (44.1%) that responded to the survey indicated that have children living in their home. Of those respondents, 16.6% have children ages 0-4 that are enrolled in daycare, pre-school, or early head start programs. Over a quarter of respondents reported that they wish their child(ren) had access to the following out of school programs:

- Music, art, dance, theater (39.1%)
- Tutoring/academic support (32.9%)
- Outdoor recreation (29.2%)
- Summer camps (29.2)
- Teen employment (28.0%)
- Sports/fitness (26.7%)

When asked about the biggest barrier to childcare solutions for their family, if any, over half of respondents indicated there were no barriers.




Figure 1: Barriers to Childcare Solutions

Housing

Nearly three-quarters (65.3%) of all respondents reported that they would rate their current housing as Very good or Good.




Figure 2: Housing Rating

For those individuals that rated their current housing as Very good or Good, half or more of those respondents provided the following reasons:

- Affordable (72.1%)
- Apartment design/layout (53.7%)
- Apartment condition (52.7%)
- Location (49.5%)

For those individuals that <u>did not</u> rate their current housing as Very good or Good, over a third of those respondents provided the following reasons:

- Other (45.3%)
- Apartment condition (44.5%)
- Community conditions (44.1%)

Employment

Most of the residents that responded to the survey are unemployed or underemployed. Their situations are highlighted in the table below. There are some notable differences in the employment status of those residing in elderly or family housing. Forty percent of elderly respondents reported that they are retired.



The majority of respondents indicated that they (or other adults in their home) do not need assistance in finding employment (91.2%) nor do they want information on free employment training (82.9%). The most common reasons given by respondents for conditions that could help people in their home/community overcome barriers to get a job or stay employed were:

- Continued access to government benefits even if income increases (47.7%)
- More accommodations for people with a disability (44.5%)
- Access to certification programs (43.5%)

Safety & Security

Less than half of respondents (39.8%) indicated that their community was Very Safe or Safe.

The top safety issues identified by respondents were drug activity, non-residents or guests causing issues and gun violence.

More than three out of four respondents (77.1%) indicated that they would like to see more police/law enforcement presence in their community. Ways in which the police department could improve services in the community, were having more of a presence, working with youth and supporting a community watch.

Those respondents living in elderly communities were asked if anyone in their home has difficulties with certain activities, half of the respondents (49.5%) reported walking or climbing stairs was a difficulty. While 31.7% of respondents indicated that none of the issues that were presented caused difficulty for anyone in their home, over a quarter (28.7%) reported that "concentrating, remembering, and making decisions" was a difficulty for someone in their home.

Health & Nutrition

Over half of respondents indicated that they have Medicare (59.8%) or Medicaid (51.3%) for their health insurance. When asked if they were sick today and needed assistance, over half of respondents indicated they would either call their primary care doctor (55.5%) or go to the Emergency Room (50.4%).

Affordable food, followed by access to fresh foods and vegetables, and emergency food assistance/food pantry were the top 3 areas of food needs that respondents identified in their community.

Almost three-quarters (71.7%) of respondents indicated that they are currently enrolled in and receiving SNAP/Food Stamps or WIC. Almost half of the households that responded indicated that within the last 12 months:

- they worried whether their food would run out before they got the money to buy more (46.2%)
- the food they bought just didn't last and they didn't have the money to get more (43.5%)

The majority of respondents reported that they get their groceries from the supermarket or grocery (95.2%) or Dollar General or another discount retailer (64.8%). Approximately a quarter of respondents get their groceries from a food pantry (26.5%) or a convenience store or gas station (25.4%). Most households that participated in the survey do not have a cat or dog (71.0%). However, for those that do, 44.6% reported that in the past two years, there has been a time that they wanted/needed treatment for an illness/emergency for their pet and were not able to get it.

Connectivity

For residents that responded having internet (62.6%), they get access through a variety of means, including some families that are able to get access through Knox County Schools.





Figure 4: Internet Access

Over one-third of respondents (39.9%) indicated that aside from their smart phones, they have access to a computer (i.e., desktop, laptop or tablet).

Transportation

Respondents most commonly reported that they travel using their own transportation (44.6%). The next most common means of travel were having someone else drive them (38.0%) or taking the KAT bus (37.8%). Of those that use the KAT bus, 70.9% of those respondents indicated that they could accomplish their transportation needs. Over half of respondents (55.0%) reported that there are not things that keep them or other members of their home from walking or bicycling safely in their community.

Outdoor Spaces



Over half of respondents rated the outdoor space in their community favorably.

The outdoor spaces that respondents identified that they would like most in their community were:

- Picnic areas (48.0%)
- Basketball court (42.3%)
- Playground (33.9%)
- Community garden (33.0%)
- Yard space (30.7%)

Less than half of respondents (43.5%) indicated that they think their community needs more plants and trees. Most residents that responded to the survey would like more outdoor events in their community (60.3%). Those respondents that reside in family community housing indicated that they <u>do not</u> feel like children in their community have a safe place to play and gather.

Community

Over half of respondents chose the following as things that they like about their community:

- Grocery stores nearby (61.7%)
- Convenient bus stops (56.5%)
- Churches nearby (44.7%)
- Shopping and retail nearby (42.0%)
- Community location (41.6%)

The top 3 supportive services that respondents reported needing most in their community were affordable housing, senior programs and services, and mental and emotional healthcare.
