Knoxville's Community Development Corporation (KCDC) provides safe and stable housing for **more than 3,700 children** in Knox County (KCDC housing and voucher housing). Recognizing that a safe home is a critical factor in student success, KCDC has established partnerships with local out-of-school programs to enhance support for youth development and academic achievement.



EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Embracing the concept of place-based transformation, KCDC and the Knoxville-Knox County Community Action Committee (CAC) Head Start program have partnered to colocate Head Start (3-5) and Early Head Centers (birth-2) on PHA family sites.

AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMMING

KCDC partners with the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Tennessee Valley to offer after-school K-5 programming at four on-site learning centers located at resident communities.

ADDITIONAL YOUTH PROGRAMMING

Two partners, the Baptist Association and the Emerald Youth Foundation, offer K-5 and teen programming adjacent to three KCDC resident communities and serve youth from each of the sites.

Five Points

- North Ridge Crossing

Early Learning Key

Two joint facilities **to open ideally before August 2027** that will address community health and education needs, serving as a teaching and research center to expand evidence-based, high-quality, affordable child care and early learning for inner-city Knoxville while also serving health care needs.

Youth Development a Focus

A partnership to combine Fostering Youth to Independence (FYI) housing vouchers with two- and four-year college scholarships to create pathways for foster youth to confidently pursue higher education. KCDC is currently working with developers and educational institutions to embrace the idea.
